## **Background Information**

The United States, Great Britain, and a coalition of other countries began a war against Iraq on the 20th of March, 2003, despite the official opposition of the United Nations (UN) and numerous other countries, including France, Germany, and Russia. Ever since the beginning, the motivation for the war as well as its legitimacy have been hotly debated all over the world, and still remain controversial. In Canada, and especially in Quebec, thousands of people gathered in the streets to display their disagreement with the war and to demand that the Canadian Governement not be involved.



As a strong defender of peace, the student is invited to write a short text in their preferred style that presents a pacifist view opposing the war. Their opinion must be composed of arguments convincing readers through valid reasoning.
